




12. For each work of art That becomes physical There are many variations That do not.


- 13. A work of art may be understood as a conductor from The artests mind to The rewers. But it may never reach The newer, or it may never leave The artists mind.

Straight Lines from Left to Right, Sol Lewitt, 1972


