

Training Module Syllabus

Module Description and Goals

Welcome! The purpose of this module is to introduce the idea of educating for virtuous intellectual character, which is the overarching goal of the *Anteater Virtues* Project. This project focuses on four key intellectual virtues, which we believe lie at the heart of one's educational experience, and which we aim to foster at UCI. These are the *Anteater Virtues*: curiosity, integrity, intellectual humility, and intellectual tenacity.



Curiosity

Being driven by a desire for the truth to undertake inquiries into important matters¹



Integrity

Being open and honest in one's dealings with others/oneself²



Intellectual humility

Recognizing the fallibility of one's own beliefs, hence being willing to learn from others and their expertise/experience³



Intellectual tenacity

Having the intellectual 'grit' to continue your inquiries in the face of obstacles⁴

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Module Overview

This training module consists of several videos, each focusing on a different relevant aspect of educating for virtuous intellectual character. After viewing each video, you will complete a short, multiple-choice quiz.

The training module begins with an overview of the *Anteater Virtues* Project, and a look at Chancellor Howard Gilman's 2022 Convocation Address, in which he speaks about how the *Anteater Virtues* cohere with UCI's academic mission. We then introduce the general notion of educating for virtuous intellectual character, and how the educational development of virtuous intellectual character is measured. We take a look at the notion of intellectual virtues (what they are, and how they relate to other excellences), as well as narrow down our focus to the four *Anteater Virtues*. We also examine principles of teaching for virtuous intellectual character, and opportunities for practicing and modelling these principles in our own classrooms.
