

Dear Conference Attendee:

Welcome to **A Body of Knowledge – Embodied Cognition and the Arts!** I hope everyone finds this event stimulating and rewarding. My goal in organising this event is to help to stimulate interaction between the cognitive science community and the arts community (and philosophers and anthropologists and neuroscientists and computer scientists...). I believe that concepts arising from post-cognitivist paradigms provide leverage on the qualities of intelligent action in the world - which is what artists do.

I initiated this project as a result of my conviction which has grown through 25 years of practise and research: internalist paradigms only confuse attempts to discuss creative intelligent practice. For much of the last century, explanations of the cognitive dimensions of arts practices have been unsatisfying, and this is because internalist paradigms provides few useful tools to discuss embodied dimensions of cognition.

In conversations about cognition, internalism-mentalism-cognitivism-computationalism has reinforced a Cartesian hierarchy which has marginalised the arts and other embodied practices because of its lack of capacity to recognize or assess intelligent action. More generally, it has profoundly skewed accepted notions of cognition by emphasizing the idea of thinking as logical reasoning in an abstract space, thereby separating perception from action and thinking from doing. As Gilbert Ryle noted long ago, and as artists of all stripes have always known: *“When I do something intelligently,...I am doing one thing and not two. My performance has a special procedure or manner, not special antecedents”*.

I hope that this interdisciplinary gathering helps to generate a new discourse about cognition which is relevant and useful to arts practitioners, and those who think about practise. In addition, I hope it contributes to a more general questioning of the privileging of abstraction over performance and practise in the academic environment.

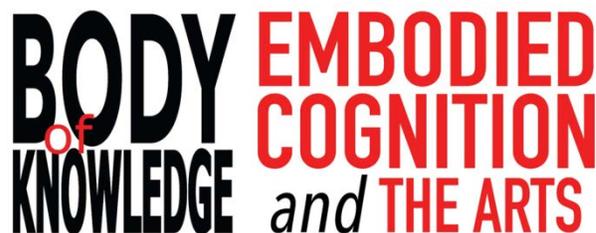

ON CAMPUS WIFI

The UC Irvine Wi-Fi network is called [UCInet Mobile Access](#). All computers must be registered with their MAC address and all use must comply with the UCI [Computer and Network Use Policy](#). Use must be consistent with the educational mission of the University:

- no unauthorized access (e.g., sniffing, hacking, port scanning)
- no peer-to-peer applications
- no insecure equipment may be connected (e.g., unpatched systems)
- no downloading/sharing unauthorized copyrighted materials
- no excessive use of bandwidth (particularly off-campus)
- no interfering with normal network operations
- Note: this is not an exhaustive list; please be courteous

RESTRICTIONS ON VISITOR ACCESS:

- Visitor access to the UC Irvine network is granted for a 24 hour period.
- All ports are blocked except Web traffic (HTTP and HTTPS), Email (IMAP and authenticated SMTP) and SSH (port 22).

HOW TO GET ON-LINE:

- We have Visitor Wi-Fi available in all our rooms, and much of the outdoor area (outdoor signal strength may vary).

Get on-line using [Express Registration](#):

- Make sure your wireless card is active and connect to UCInet Mobile Access.
- Open your Web browser and try to connect to any Web page (ex: <http://uci.edu>).
- You will be directed to the Express Registration web page.
- Click Register as a Visitor of UCI.
- Read the Visitor agreement and fill in the Web form with your name,
- Email address and reason for visiting the campus (Body of Knowledge).
- Click the Submit button.

Your computer's hardware address will be automatically detected and registered for access to our mobile network. After 2 minutes you should be redirected to the Web page you were trying to access. If you cannot connect, try again in a few minutes. Your computer may take a few minutes to update its network settings. If you still cannot connect, try rebooting your computer.
