

Humanities students:

Are you interested in learning about a range of digital humanities research skills (such as mapping, text analysis, digital storytelling, or network analysis) and prototyping your own digital project?

Up to three UCI undergraduates majoring in a humanities discipline will receive a fellowship of \$1,200 to participate in workshops, conduct research, and design a digital project during summer quarter 2023.

Selected fellows may choose a research topic, such as <u>Shakespeare</u> (coinciding with the New Swan Shakespeare Festival), <u>Southeast Asian American communities</u> (digital collections available to work with through UCI Libraries), or fellows may choose their own topic.

Fellows will be paired with a mentor in the UCI Libraries, who will help them think through the integration of technology and research based on the skill sets most suited to their project. At the end of the fellowship period, students will present their work in a showcase.

Fellowship period will begin on **Monday, June 19th**, run for ten weeks, and can be done virtually.
