

All courses for the major must be taken for letter grades.

Residency Requirement in the major: At least five upper-division courses required for the major must be completed successfully at UCI. Students are encouraged, however, to complete up to a year of their language study in approved programs of study abroad.

Testing Information: The Chinese placement exam is required for enrollment in any Chinese courses at UCI. Sign up for the written placement exam at www.testingcenter.uci.edu. Complete an oral placement exam with the Chinese Department. After your oral interview, you will receive your final placement and an authorization code to enroll in the appropriate Chinese course. **Students with no background in Chinese** who wish to enroll in Chinese 1A should fill out a Language Background Survey.
