## All courses for the major must be taken for letter grades

Residency Requirement in the major: English 100, 101W, two English 102 courses and English 106 must be successfully completed at UCI.
NOTE: All English courses require completion of the lower-division writing requirement as a prerequisite. If you completed lower-division writing at another school and are unable to register for a class, please submit a Course Authorization Request on the Humanities Undergraduate website (www.humanities.uci.edu/undergrad).

## Select three of the following, one of which must be English 15:

English 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 15, 16, 17
English 8, 9, 10, 11 \& 12 have no prerequisites; English 15, 16 \& 17 require completion of lower-division writing.

English 10 and 15 may be taken more than once as topics vary.

Upper-division English courses do NOT need to be taken in sequential order, except where prerequisites are noted.
For example, English 105 may be taken before English 100, English 102B may be taken before English 102A, etc.
Most upper-division English classes are topics vary, which means that they may be taken multiple times for credit, if the topic is different.
For example, you may earn credit for both English 105-Asian American Writers and for English 105—African Literature.
