

### All courses for the major must be taken for letter grades

**Residency Requirement in the major:** Five upper-division courses must be successfully completed at UCI, of which a maximum of three may be taught entirely in English. By petition, a maximum of four upper-division courses taken through study abroad may be counted toward the major requirement. Use of study abroad courses is subject to approval by the Humanities Office of Undergraduate Study and the Director of the undergraduate program in French.

Upper-division French courses do NOT need to be taken in sequential order, except where prerequisites are noted.

French 110, 116, 117, 118, 119, 120, 125, 127, 140, 150, 160, 170, 171, and 180 courses are **topics vary**, which means that they may be taken multiple times for credit, if the topic is different.

For example, you may earn credit for both French 150 Political Fictions and for French 150 Body At Renaissance.

<b>Ten Upper-Division French courses</b>  French 102A, 102B, 102C, 102D, and 102E may not be applied here.  <b>A maximum of four of the ten may be taught entirely in English.</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>⇒ French 139W and French 150 are always taught in English.</li> <li>⇒ French courses with a 2C prerequisite are considered “in French.”</li> <li>⇒ French courses with no prerequisites are assumed to be in English, unless the French department notifies the SOH Office of Undergraduate Study otherwise.</li> </ul>	1)
