

All courses for the major must be taken for letter grades.

Residency Requirement in the major: At least five upper-division courses required for the major must be completed successfully at UCI. Students are encouraged, however, to complete up to a year of their language study in approved programs of study abroad.

Testing Information: A placement exam is required for enrollment in all Japanese language courses at UCI. Sign up for the written placement exam at www.testingcenter.uci.edu. Complete an oral interview with the Japanese Department. After your oral interview, you will receive your final placement and an authorization code to enroll in the appropriate language course.

Students with no background who wish to enroll in Japanese 1A should fill out a Language Background Survey Language Background Survey. Check testingcenter.uci.edu "Placement Testing Program" for more information.

NOTE: Japanese 1A, 2A and 3A are only offered in Fall quarter. Japanese 1B, 2B and 3B are only offered in Winter quarter. Japanese 1C, 2C and 3C are only offered in Spring quarter. Additionally, Japanese S1ABC and S2ABC may be offered during the summer as intensive language courses.

Japanese 3C (or equivalent) <i>Students who place higher than 3C must substitute this course with an upper-division Japanese topic course. Japanese 100A may <u>not</u> be used as a substitute if used for another requirement below.</i> <i>Completion of Japanese 1A-1B-1C, 2A-2B-2C and 3A-3B (or equivalent), or placement in Japanese 3C is prerequisite to enrollment in Japanese 3C.</i>	1)
