Residency Requirement in the major: Literary Journalism 20, 21, 100, 101A, and three 101BW courses must be successfully completed at UCI.

NOTE: Most English and Literary Journalism courses require completion of the lower-division writing requirement as a prerequisite. If you completed lower-division writing at another school and are unable to register for a class, please submit a Course Authorization Request on the Humanities Undergraduate website (www.humanities.uci.edu/undergrad).

Students can substitute Comparative Literature 60A or Comparative Literature 60C for the lower-division English course requirement.
