
- Cloud Atlas from very early on in the novel tracks the repetive devolution of history, in Marx's terms, from tragedy to farce.
- HOWEVER, and this is the tricky part, history is also paradoxically preserved by the very mechanisms that function to erase it.



Cloud Atlas focuses on the problem of the minority by emphasizing "lateral" relations over "vertical" relations.

In so doing, it also supplants a historical sense of minority with a formal sense of minority (preview).

Walled World



(A) The Demilitarized Zone (or DMZ)

in Korea is a strip of land running across the Korea North and Periinaula that serves as a buffer zone between North and South Korea. The DMZ was created in the ceasefire of July 27th 1953 and cuts the Korean Peninsula roughly in half. It is 248 km long and approximately 4 km wide.

The Melilla border fence

is a separation barrier between Morocco and the Spanish city of Meills. The razor wire barrier cost Spain 433 million to construct, it consists of 11 km of parallel 3 m high fences topped with barried wire. Its height is doubled to 6 m.

The Ceuta border fence

is a separation barrier between Monocco and the Autonomous City of Ceuts, in Spain. Construction of the 630-million rapor wire barrier wasfinanced by the European Union. It consists of parallel 3-metre fencies topped with barbed wire.

The Australian Defence Force

(ADF) conducts surveillance and response operations in Australia's northern approaches. Since September 2001 it doubled the number of days Customs visions are at sea and increased flying hours for surveillance alteraft by 20 per cert. E Schengen Border

is an agreement emong European states which allows for common policy on the temporary entry of persons and a border system. A total of 31 countries – including all European Union states except the Republic of Ireland and the United Kingdom, but including non-EU inembers (celland, Norway, and Seutzerland – have signed the agreement and 25 have fully implemented it.

The Republic of Ireland and the United Kingdom did not sign the Schengen Agreement but take part in the Schengen co-operation and use the Schengen Information Bystem for law enforcement properties.

The United States-Mexico barrier

Is actually several separation barriers designed to prevent illegal immigration into the United States. The 3.140 km booser between the United States and Merico traverses a variety of formarias, including unben areas and deserts. The barrier is located mainly in the unban sections of the border which include San Diego. California and El Paso. Texas. Between 1995 and 2004, 1.954 persons are officially reported to have died along the US-Merico border. According to Wo Morro Deather, 1.065 bodies of migrants have been recovered in the southern Arizona desert between 2004 and 2005. The "Secure Fence Act of 2005" enacted in October 2006 allows for over 1.100 km of double-enferioped fence.

The West Bank barrier

is a physical barrier being constituted by lorsed consisting of a network of fences with vehicle-barrier transfers surrounded by an on average 60 meters wide exclusion area and up to 8 meters high concrete waits. As of January 2008 the length of the barrier as approved by the issued government is 670 kilometers. Approximately 58% has been constituted, 9% is under construction and construction has not yet begun on 33%. Accelerated through the fear from the attacks of 9/11 and all what followed, the so called "Western Society" is constructing the greatest wall ever build on this planet. On different building sites on all five inhabitable continents, walls, fences and high-tech border surveillance are under construction in order to secure the citizens and their high quality of life within this system.

The fall of the Berlin Wall was described as the historical moment that marks the demolition of world's last barrier between nation states. Yet it took the European Union only six years to create with the Schengen Agreement in 1995 a new division only 80km offset to the east of Berlin. Together with the wall in Israel, the US- Mexican border, the Australian Coast Defence and the DMZ in Korea, it makes part of a worldwide system that contains an exclusive society (14% of worlds population) with an average income of € 2.500,-/month versus the ones in front of the wall with an average income of only € 150,-/month.
