


Origami Towel Mask - V0.1






Materials and Tools


- 1 Wypall Brand towel
- 2 elastic ties about 1 ft long
- 10 staples and stapler
- adhesive coffee tin or wire




1. Fold along horizontal axis, then fold again along horizontal axis.




2. Inside-reverse fold each bottom corner leaving a one inch margin at the top. After operation, you should have a *boat shape* with two *tabs*, each two plys thick.



3. Rotate piece 180 degrees so you have a *hat shape*. Fold the top *tab* up. Tuck the *bottom tab* into the *hat shape* over the *reverse folded corners* from step **2**. Staple the folded *bottom tab* to the *reverse folded corners*.



4. Fold the *top tab* into the *hat shape* making sure to fold over the *lower tab* so that the edges are aligned and the *tabs* are perpendicular to each other. They should overlap in a square. Starting with one corner, align each *elastic strap* with each folded *tab* and staple two staples in a cross through the towel layers and straps. Use two more staples to secure the straps. Repeat on the other corner, making sure to align the straps with the correct *tab*.



5. Turn the shape inside out. Carefully push the top of the hat shape through the the folded tabs.



6. Install the coffee tin. Remove the adhesive back, open the *top tab* and place the coffee tin sticky side down inside the crease. If using wire, you can secure the wire with a staple. Your mask is ready to don!
